THE MOTOR ROAD TO KOSCIUSKO

Every motorist should aspire to driving his car to the very Summit of Mount Kosciusko.

The scenery of the Alpine National Chase is grand in the extreme, and is enhanced by the beauty or the snowfields.

The powerful motor snow plough being utilised at Kosciusko enables cars to reach the Hotel at 5000 feet even in the depth of Winter, and frequently to continue several miles along the Alpine road toward the Summit, to the impenetrable drifts. In Spring and early Summer the road is open to the Chalet at the 6000-feet level, and as the Summer advances the drifts are cleared, until it is possible to drive right to the trigonometrical cairn marking the highest point in the Australian continent.

Sport on the snow can usually be enjoyed in these altitudes the whole year round.

The Alpine Chase is watered by many snow-fed trout streams. Several Alpine Lakes above the 6000-feet level afford delightful scenery, and when the snow eventually recedes the mountainsides are bedecked with miles of snow daisies, buttercups, violets, and flowering heath. The majesty of the mountain and canyon scenery in the ever-changing light is beyond description, and unparalleled in the continent.

The Hotel Kosciusko provides every modern comfort, garages and petrol, and snow sporting material is always available. The ski-ing courses during the weekly carnivals are a veritable kaleidoscope of color, and the speed and dexterity of the runners offer a thrill you have, perhaps, never before experienced.

The beauty of the snow—miles and miles of it—mantling the trees, scintillating in the sunlight—the shadow mosaics thrown by the snow gums — make Kosciusko an entirely new world to explore. Go and see it. Participate in the winter revelry and the all-year-round fascinations of this glorious Alpine domain.

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

The Motor Road to Kosciusko

Turn off Parramatta Road into Liverpool Road at the five-mile peg. Camden is reached at 38 miles. Continue to Mittagong and the Cross Roads to Goulburn, 136 miles. Goulburn has a splendid golf links and fine tourist hotels.

Two routes are then available—one via Tarago, Bungendore, and Queanbeyan, and the Federal Highway, via Yarra, Collector, and Canberra. The latter has the attraction of leading through the Federal Capital City. Spring and early Summer are blossom time at Canberra, which is aptly designated the "City of Flowers."

Leaving Canberra, take the road past Federal Parliament House to East Lake. Turn right on to the Tharwa Road and thence to Royalla, the route being indicated by a signpost. This section is narrow but good surface. Care should be exercised in passing over a number of cattle grids which have been placed at intervals where gates had previously to be opened.

The road to Cooma is joined at 17.7 miles leading through Michelago and Bredbo. Continue through Cooma up the hill on to the Berridale road. At 4 miles a signpost indicates Adaminaby to the right. The Kosciusko road continues straight on. Berridale, 19.7 miles, is reached along good road. Fifteen miles of winding and hilly road are encountered before reaching Jindabyne, but the surface is good. Negotiate the last three miles carefully, as curves are plentiful, and there are several blind corners. The view of the valley of the Snowy during the descent is very fine.

Cross the Snowy at Jindabyne and turn sharply to the right. Five miles and the Thredbo River is crossed at The Creel, popular with anglers in the trout season. An almost continuous but well-graded ascent of nine miles and the Hotel Kosciusko comes into view, nestling at the foot of a range, fronted by a beautiful Lake which, frozen in Winter, is popular with ice skaters. Hotel accommodation may be secured in advance either by telephoning the Manager or booking at the Government Tourist Bureau before leaving Sydney.

The Summit is 17 miles above the hotel. A chain of shelters has been established, each connected by telephone to the hotel. The Chalet at Charlotte Pass is a miniature hotel with accommodation for 70 guests. Following is a table of altitudes and distances from Hotel Kosciusko:
